Our dedicated Year 12 teachers will be running holiday classes for our impending graduates to ensure that they are fully prepared for their final exams. I have no doubt, that our Year 12 students will do very well, thanks to the teachers and parents who have so abundantly supported them.

I have heard and seen nothing but high praise and happiness radiating from anyone who attended the annual Forever Young concert at Ulumbarra Theatre on Tuesday this week. Our Head of Junior School music, Mrs Laura Dusseljee, managed to orchestrate another sell-out concert for Bendigo's luckiest group of seniors. Special guest Mark Seymour was an inspired addition to this year's concert and, fully backed by Girton's Senior String Orchestra and Rock Band, something special happened at the event, ensuring that the choir yet again won the hearts and minds of the audience. What a thrill for our students to provide musical backing for one of Australia's most seminal rock legends. I am sure they will remember the experience forever.

Likewise, I would like to pass on my warmest congratulations to the staff and students involved in this year's Year 8 production of Singin' in the Rain. Lead actors Noah Lawrence (8 Riley), Lucy Kitching (8 Aherne) and Stirling Bellingham (8 Jones), by all accounts were outstanding and many people have suggested to me that this production was one of the best Year 8 productions ever staged at the School.

I also wish to congratulate Sophie Shoebridge (10 Jones) on being selected as Captain of the under 17 North Central State Netball team, an incredible achievement at just 15 years of age.

Three of our Tournament of Minds teams have qualified to compete at the National event in Adelaide on 28th October. Girton's results in the tournament represent the first time that a Secondary School has won more than two of the four categories of competition at the State Finals and it is the fourth consecutive year that Girton has competed at the National level in this fantastic event. I wish all students representing the School next month the very best of luck.

We currently have 32 students, 4 staff members and 4 parents on a STEM trip in the USA. The group has already attended a Space Camp in Alabama and enjoyed activities such as flight simulators and engineering design challenges, and is now in Houston visiting a number of attractions including the Kennedy Space Centre. The group has been closely monitored and managed in the wake of Hurricane Irma, which severely affected the State of Florida. Under the leadership of Mrs Jane Reaburn and in consultation with a support team at the School, led in my absence by Mrs Robyn MacCulloch, the group has remained safe at all times and adapted to travel conditions as required. Teachers are expected to wear many hats, including during incident management, and I could not say with more confidence how deftly staff dealt with the uncertainties of Hurricane Irma to ensure a safe and fulfilling STEM trip for all participants.

This leads me to offer my most sincere thanks to my esteemed Deputy, Mrs Robyn MacCulloch, who has so ably, led the School community over the past weeks. Schools are dynamic places, full of ever changing and very real human needs, making it a surprisingly difficult thing for a Head to leave for an extended period. I am only able to do so knowing that the School is in such good hands.

As is customary, Term 3 will end with the Senior School formal this evening and I wish our students an enjoyable evening with friends.

Please be sure to nurture our Year 12 students when you see them, as they embark on their final weeks of School and as they rally around one another and help each other do their best. I wish all families a safe and enjoyable two week holiday and very much look forward to Term 4.

The event commenced with the Opening of the Junior School Art Exhibition on the evening of Thursday 14th of September and all who were present were again amazed by the creativity on display. Mrs James works tirelessly to ensure that our children are able to view, appreciate, understand and then produce art to a standard that goes far beyond the expectation for children so young. Such is her commitment that she has already started planning for next year's Art Exhibition and educational experiences. As a school we are fortunate to have an Art teacher with such passion for bringing art alive for our children. Mrs James arranged for local sculptor and artist Mr Andre Sardone to open the exhibition. Andre reflected on the nature of art and how we can draw inspiration from famous artists to enhance our creativity. It is all the more remarkable when we consider that of the 16 girls who represented us only 6 actually play soccer and 3 were in Year 4. In the Grand final the girls were outclassed by a team who have a soccer club based at their school and who play together as a team. I am sure this will be an achievement that the girls remember forever. The girls would like to thank all of



the parents who travelled to support them throughout the various tournaments and to Mr de Vries for his excellent photography.

We were also very excited to get the news that one of our students has been awarded a medal for excellence in Spelling. Zoe MacGregor 6 Riley is a medal winner in the International Competitions and Assessment Centre (ICAS) Spelling Assessments. These assessments are conducted by the Educational Assessment arm of the University of New South Wales. Zoe will be presented with her medal in a ceremony to be held in Melbourne later in the year. This too is an extraordinary achievement with only 0.05% of students tested receiving a medal. To give a context to this award 980 000 students attempted ICAS tests in Spelling, Maths, Reading, Writing, English, Science and Computer Studies this year.

We also received news that Maddison Smith's (4 Frew), entry in the NSW Education Blast Off School Magazine competition was selected as a winning entry. Blast Off is a literary magazine for young authors. Maddison will now be a published author! We are all looking forward to reading her story in the October issue of the magazine.




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GHOSTS OF THE ORPHANAGE



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HOUSE COLOURS

At the commencement of Term 4 students will be encouraged to apply for House Colours. The process is outlined below. These Criteria are also displayed on the House Notice Board. Students who have queries regarding the process should see their House tutors.



Full House Colours are awarded in Years 10,11 and 12

Half House Colours are awarded in Years 7, 8 and 9

A student is eligible to be considered for House Colours by demonstrating a breadth of involvement in the life of the School. To be considered for House Colours students must make formal application.

- I. Breadth of commitment to the House which should include:
 - Participation in the major sporting carnivals and Spirit Cup Performances
 - Active participation in the Annual House
 Dinner
 - Being a positive contributor to House Singing
- Fulfilling the Cocurricular expectations 2 activities per semester (unless some variation is granted by the Head of CoCurriculum or the Head of Student Wellbeing)
- 3. Involvement in School Sport AND/OR Performance
- Completed a recognised Community Service (registered through ASTRA and the Head of Community Service)
- 5. Given a speech to an approved audience such as:

- Inter House Public Speaking
- Headmaster's , Religious or House Assemblies (please note that Master of Ceremonies at an assembly or Prayer Readers do not count as Public Speaking. They will be taken into consideration as Service to School.)
- House Dinner
- Lions Youth of the Year
- Member of a Debating Team
- 6. Service to School such as :
 - MC Prayer Reader
 - Open Day Guide
 - Junior School sports assistant
 - ANZAC Day attendee
- 7. Full House Colours applicants must have demonstrated Leadership throughout the year. The fact that a student does not hold a formal position does not preclude them from being eligible for the award.
- Half House Colours applicants must have demonstrated Citizenship throughout the Year. The good citizen is one who shows:
 - Excellence of behaviour in the classroom and the playground leads by example
 - Kindness and support of others in the



classroom and in the playground – leads by example

- Is always an excellent ambassador for the school (uniform, behaviour etc) – leads by example
- 9. Other aspects of School Life taken into account include:
 - Punctuality and regular attendance
 - reliability
 - willingness to take on extra duties
 - appropriate grooming, uniform and presentation
 - enthusiasm, initiative and helpfulness
 - any other behaviour or attitudes believed relevant.

Students submit their own Colours application form at the start of Term 4 via the House Tutors. These are reviewed in a meeting of all House Staff, chaired by the Head of House. Nominations deemed suitable by this group will be tabled at a Colours Committee comprising the Head of Student Wellbeing and the 6 Heads of House. The Headmaster has the power of veto to be exercised if he considers any candidate unworthy, by reason of poor behaviour or presentation, to carry the honour under consideration.

eSports

eSports take the form of organized, multiplayer video game competitions, particularly between professional players. The most common video game genres associated with eSports are realtime strategy games. Tournaments such as the League of Legends World Championship provide live broadcasts of the competitions, and sponsors provide big prize money to competitors.

In the 2016 League of Legends finals, the amount of unique viewers that tuned in every day via online and television channels reached 396 million. The Los Angeles bid for the 2024 Summer Olympics was inspired by the success of 2016 League of Legends World Championship and is considering to plan and include eSports in the Olympic Games if they win the bid.

The League of Legends prize pool is now \$1,000,000. They pick a growing game – for example Pub-G (Player Unknown's Battleground) is generating interest and there is now a competition for that being held in Cologne Germany and the prize pool \$350,000 on August 23-26. It is sponsored by ESL (E-sports league) and held in a soccer stadium. One of our GirtOnline members went to an event in a big stadium in Sydney with people playing for \$250,000, playing Counter-strike Global Offensive. There are full time professional players, who train all week and then travel the world playing computer games for cash. Companies sponsor the players and look after them with accommodation and meals.

An average level team salary is currently \$17,000 per month, distributed between 5 players, and a coach. So some gamers are earning about \$40,000 per year. Patrick Lindberg (code named Forest) has made \$366,000 from 170 tournaments over the last three years.

Headmaster at Girton Grammar School, Mr Matthew Maruff. said that the TEDx Bendigo event is open to anyone with an interest in how people connect with the world around them.

"TEDx is a unique concept, allowing people to share ideas internationally through the hosting of local events that are uploaded to the TED website.

"The concept helps to promote conversations that genuinely matter in a powerful and accessible format.

"We are expecting our speakers to tackle the topic from a range of angles, including exploring the concept of genuine connection in a world that is becoming smaller, with people better connected than ever through digital channels," Mr Maruff said.

We had a very successful day, with the Senior Engineering Mathematics, Senior Language Literature and Senior Social Sciences teams winning their divisions. This meant that three of the four senior divisions were won by Girton teams, a record in the Victorian competition. Senior Science Technology and Junior Engineering Mathematics received Honours, and Junior Science Technology performed extremely well.

Unlike at Regionals, competitors could not fully prepare for the State tournament. During the event, each team was shut in a classroom with their problem and some basic materials, known as a "lockdown". They had three hours to solve the problem, then develop a ten minute performance of this solution to be presented to the judges and audience. During this time, they also had to complete an impromptu spontaneous challenge.

Three hours may seem like forever, but in a lockdown it seems like no time at all. Compared with the six weeks allowed to prepare for Regionals, the State Finals are a completely different experience. The stress and complexity of a lockdown challenge is a most exacting test of teamwork and problem solving for even the most experienced competitors.

The three winning Girton teams will now have the amazing opportunity to compete at a national level in the Australasia-Pacific Finals in Adelaide on Saturday 28th October. This competition will emulate the state competition with a lockdown and spontaneous challenge.

Overall, the 2017 State Final was a wonderful day. Girton students had the opportunity to watch a variety of different performances and learn from seeing other fine schools perform. A huge thank you to everyone who participated throughout the day, especially those who facilitated, and to Mrs Bath for the huge amount of effort she has put in leading up to the event. Congratulations to all teams and best of luck to those going forwards to the Nationals in October.

From Graphic Design and Mechatronics to Medicine and Motherhood, this cohort has taken off in all directions and is already looking forward to their 10 Year Reunion.


























OGA Departing Girtonian Scholarship

Withdrawal of Students

Parents are reminded of Point 4 of the Business Regulations regarding withdrawal of students. 4. WITHDRAWAL OF STUDENTS

To withdraw a student from the School, at least one complete term's notice, including the preceding vacation, must be given in writing to the Headmaster. If the required minimum notice of one complete term's notice, including the preceding vacation period (in writing to the Headmaster), as described in the following examples, is not given for withdrawal from the School, a Tuition Withdrawal Fee equal to one tuition fee instalment will apply. There is no Prompt Payment Discount for a Tuition Withdrawal Fee. For example:

(a) Students leaving at the end of the school year (except Year 12 students) or during the following vacation or during First Term the following year will need to have provided notice in writing to the Headmaster no later than 5 p.m. on the last school day of Third Term (in September).

(b) Students departing at the end of second Term or during Third Term will need to have provided notice in writing to the Headmaster by the last school day of the First Term. Please also note that once the signed enrolment Form is received, and the first instalment of the Capital Fee is paid, the student is deemed to be enrolled in the School. Hence the notice of withdrawal period as described in Clause 4 is required to be given if a parent subsequently decides not to proceed.

Benefits of commencing a Girton Grammar School Education at Prep.





Our School's Pastoral Care system includes my specialised services which include consultancy, counselling and educational assessments for students of all ages in both the Junior and Senior School.

The consultancy services involve regular meetings with the Pastoral Care team throughout the School. Staff present student issues for discussion and support plans are made collaboratively.

Counselling Services may be initiated by parents or staff. This generally involves matters which are complex, and possibly requiring Mental Health Care Plans from General Practitioners. Such issues may include stress management, separation, anxiety, depression and grief.

Educational Psychology assessment work may also be initiated by parents, but may also occur following teacher concerns being expressed to their Head of House, LRC staff or following consultation with myself. Early identification of Specific Learning Difficulties can do much to address student skill levels and to assist them achieving their potential.
